

Castlemaine Art Museum: Expressions of Interest Terrace Projection: Youth

Castlemaine Art Museum is inviting expressions of interest from young people between the ages of 14 and 21 for the *Terrace Projections: Youth* project, no previous artistic or creative experience required.

A group of young people will be chosen to work together through a series of workshops led by local artist Leonie Van Eyk to create a video artwork that will be projected onto the external walls of Castlemaine Art Museum's iconic art deco building from Friday 29 July - Sunday 2 October 2022.

CAM's Terrace Projections series features artworks created to reflect the interests and issues important to the Castlemaine community, and to promote challenging ideas and new conversations. The voices of young people are critically important in community dialogue, and we want to hear yours.

The program:

The program will take the form of a series of 5 workshops.

The workshops will focus on developing skills in filmmaking, photography and animation, creating and collating content to build a video work that communicates the ideas of the group to an audience. The workshops will investigate art films that have inspired activism and youth political movements, to delve into thoughtful discussions around what is current and valid in this particular time. What do you as the next generation wish to say?

The film (whatever form it takes), will be projected onto CAM's external walls as part of the official gallery program and will run between 29th July – 2 October 2022.

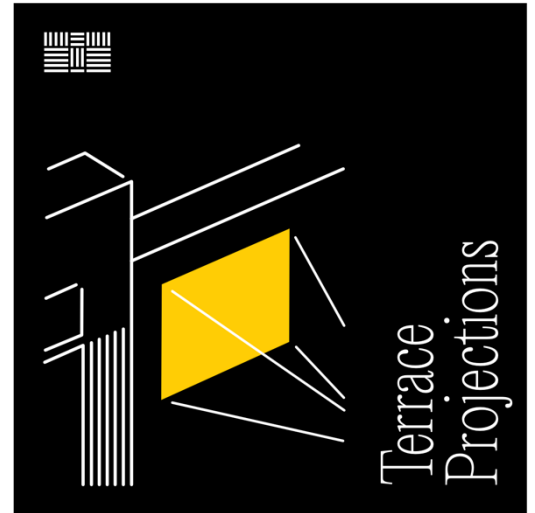
Submissions:
